The facilities are the 444 MW Richland power station (Defiance, Ohio) and the 20 MW Stryker power station (Stryker, Ohio). The installations are peaking generation stations and include seven individual peaking units. These units are principally natural gas-fired and are located in the ATSI region of PJM.

The acquisitions of the Richland and Stryker facilities represent the first transactions completed by Metropolis since its launch in February 2011. The Richland and Stryker power stations are strategically positioned in the transmission constrained PJM-ATSI region and are expected to benefit from regional capacity and energy shortfalls as a result of planned retirements of solid fuel fired generation facilities. The acquisition of these two highly reliable facilities is consistent with Metropolis' objective of acquiring, owning and optimizing efficient and reliable generation plants in key power markets.
